It's effortless. Beaver Country Day School's junior guard Keyshaun Jacobs bounces between two defenders before rising to score a contested layup. It's for this exact reason colleges like George Mason, Lehigh and Cornell have interest in the Lynn resident.

Jacobs' career began in a peewee league at the Boys & Girls Club in Lynn. Almost immediately, he knew he was different. "I remember diving onto the floor to grab a loose ball and calling for a timeout," Jacobs said, "What three-yea-old does that?" From then on, basketball became omnipresent. He began playing summer league games at the Lynn English High School, Breed Middle School and Marian Gardens.

Jacobs spent time at the Robert L. Ford Elementary School before he and his family moved

to Salem, where he attended the Collins Middle School. Basketball was always a constant, so when enrolled at Beaver Country Day School, he couldn't have been happier. Unfortunately, during his freshman year, Keyshaun was stuck behind two talented upperclassman guards. It was a true test of his character.

"It was tough, I wanted to be playing every game," Jacobs recalls. Now, two years later, BCDS Head Coach Juan Figueroa calls him a, "complete guard. He can drive, finish and is an amazing shooter. He's driven and brings an intensity to the court. On top of that it's evident he works on his strength and conditioning." While he's quite a talented player, he's still growing.

"Now, as an upperclassman, he's turning into a leader. It's a new role, but he's growing into it," said Coach Figueroa.

There is no doubt, Jacobs is one to keep an eye on.

"When I was principal at Tech, I had the opportunity to work with Ms. Cohen before she became a guidance counselor at Lynn English," said Ridley. "She will do a great job at Marshall. And she's very fortunate because she will be going in to a brand new school in September, 2017."
